From South Africa to Northern Ireland, communities across the globe are saying "Not In Our Town" to hate and intolerance.

In a small town in **Northern Ireland**, surrounded by farmland where sheep and cows graze the green hills and valleys, the story of Billings, Montana is gaining an important audience. On a stormy night in late November, about 70 people gathered in the Presbyterian Church in the heart of the town to see and discuss the film, and begin a process for uniting against hate on behalf of their neighbors of all backgrounds. They were turbulent and dangerous days in **South Africa**. Hundreds of immigrants from nearby countries were being attacked and brutalized in the townships as tensions rose over jobs and the economy earlier this year.
