Neo-Nazis descended on Leith, ND on Sept. 22, but hundreds of supporters came to express their solidarity with the small town of 20 residents. The town faced a possible takeover by the neo-Nazis, after a known white supremacist started buying up plots in the town and inviting others to create a "white enclave." 
