

## Combating Hate in Bend

## A Panel Discussion, Film Screening and Action Session

How can we make Bend a safe place to live for migrant and other marginalized communities? Combating Hate in Bend will be an educational event with the goal of bringing marginalized and privileged communities here in Bend together to create pathways for action. The evening will begin with a screening of *Not In Our Town: Light in the Darkness*. A panel discussion will follow. The discussion will be facilitated by Anyssa Bohanan, Reporter at Central Oregon Daily News. Our panelists include: Marcus LeGrand, Pathway College and Career Success Coach & Instructor with College Success at COCC; Lieutenant Clint Burleigh with the Bend Police Department; Christy Walker, Diversity and Inclusion Director at COCC; Karina Ramos, a leader with the Immigrant Solidarity Network; and Oscar Acosta, a senior at Mountain View High School and chair of the RJE Town Hall Student Advisory Council. The night will conclude with an Action Session in which audience members will be called upon to develop a path forward towards making Bend a more welcoming and inclusive place to live.
